Dr. Prabhjot Parmar conducted her research into the Indian experience of WWI as part of her post-doctoral research. Her area of specialization includes postcolonial literatures and theory; South Asian literature and cinema; migration and diaspora studies; multicultural Britain and Canada; women's studies; memory and history; world war and colonial soldiers; modern British fiction.

This introductory course is designed to introduce students to the ideas, methods and themes of the discipline of Indigenous Studies. Indigenous literature from Canada and Australia have a world view that deliberates on the relationship between spiritual philosophies, beliefs, traditions and practices that contribute to meaning of traditional lifestyles. The course hopes to achieve the following:

- Demonstrate familiarity with Indigenous literature in Canada and Australia, including its origins, diversity, and contemporary forms
- Examine the cultural aesthetics surrounding the tradition of oral storytelling and its connection to contemporary Indigenous literature
- Demonstrate an understanding of the marginalization of these literatures
- Analyze the values, politics, and concerns addressed in works of Indigenous literature
- Assess the use of literary elements such as theme, symbolism, and poetic devices
