Mathieu Flonneau is Associate Professor of Contemporary History at University Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne since 2003 and researcher at SIRICE-CRHI.

Director of Institut AES-EDS.

He is President of T²M, Traffic Transport and Mobility international association.

He belongs to the Think Tank of the Union Routière de France. He co-leads an university research group called "Passé-Présent-Mobilité," P2M.

He is also involved in RESENDEM, a research project on major technical networks and democracy, sponsored by the French National Research Agency and in the LABEX program EHNE, "Ecrire une histoire nouvelle de l'Europe". He is a Member of the *Histoire urbaine*, *Journal of Transport History* and *Transfers* editorial boards and co-editor of *T2M Yearbook*. He is co-editor of two book series: "Cultures mobiles", "Descartes & Cie" et "Mobilités & Sociétés", Publications de la Sorbonne.

He was in charge as "Commissaire invité" of the program for cultural and historical exhibitions at "Le Mondial de l'Auto" in Paris. In 2016, the theme was "Cars and movies", and in 2018, the theme was the "Mythical Roads".
