About the Dept

The Department of History was established in 1988 with faculty strength of three. During the last 20 years the department has distinguished itself among the frontline history departments across the country. Its primary mission is to promote teaching and research in the diverse fields of Indian History. The main objectives of the department are:

- To provide facilities for study and research in social, economic and cultural history of India
- To highlight the intellectual tradition and cultural heritage of India
- To explore the history of countries other than India
- To undertake the study of Historiography and the philosophy of History
- To provide knowledge of the theory and practice of historical writing

The department of History is offering M.A; M.Phil and PhD (Full time and Part Time) programmes. The M.A. programme is specially designed to provide students with a comprehensive and in depth knowledge of Indian History so as to help them perform in the National level Eligibility Tests as well as in the Civil Services Examination. Field based Archaeological studies and field trips to Archaeological and heritage sites are being carried out to enable students to have first hand information of our Historical and cultural heritage.

At present there are five regular and one guest faculty teaching in the department. They are drawn from different parts of the country and have had their academic training in India and abroad. The thrust areas of teaching and research reflect the specialization of the faculty. They are: Historiography; Ancient History; Epigraphy; Numismatics; Art & Architecture of India; Archaeological Theory and methods; Field Archaeology; Medieval History; Vijayanagara City and Empire; Modern History; Colonialism and its impact; National Movement and the making of Modern India; Women's History; Labor and Peasant History.
