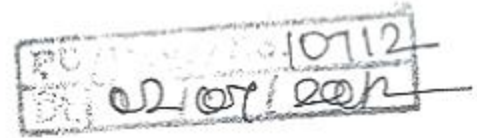

The Dr.D.C.Pavate Foundation in collaboration with Karnatak University, Dharwad and Sidney Sussex College, Cambridge offer three visiting fellowships annually for a period of four months to be held at the Centre of International Studies / Department of Politics and International Studies, Judge Business School and the Department of Applied Mathematics and Theoretical Physics / Department of Material Sciences and Metallurgy / Department of Chemistry / Department of Zoology, University of Cambridge.

Candidates below the age of 40 years as on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2013, who have secured a Ph.D., or a first class Masters Degree or its equivalent are eligible to apply for the following fellowships:

(a) **One fellowship at the Centre of International Studies / Department of Politics and International Studies, Cambridge, selected on all India basis:** The fellowship will be effective from September 2013. Candidates with good academic record in the areas of History, Political Science or International Relations, International Economics, International Law or

Military Affairs will be considered.

(b) **One fellowship at Judge Business School, Cambridge, selected from among Karnataka Candidates:** This fellowship will be effective from January 2013. Candidates from Karnataka with good academic record and interest in any aspect of Indian business and management will be considered.

(c) **One fellowship at the Department of Applied Mathematics and Theoretical Physics / Department of Material Sciences and Metallurgy / Department of Chemistry / Department of Zoology, selected from among Karnataka Candidates:** This fellowship will be effective from May 2013. Candidates from Karnataka with good academic record in the area of Mathematics and theoretical physics, Material Sciences and Metallurgy, Chemistry and Zoology will be considered. The selection and award is subject to the Department concerned identifying a host research group accepting the successful candidate. Further information on the research groups and / or their faculty members' research interests can be found on the departmental websites of the University of Cambridge.

**Karnataka Candidate:** (i) Educated for a minimum of 5 years continuously at an educational institution located in Karnataka, or (ii) employed in Karnataka for a minimum of 5 years continuously.

The fellowships will cover economy class return air fare, stipend of 3500 pounds sterling and the appreciate academic charges.

## Dr. D.C. Pavate Memorial Visiting Fellowships In Cambridge



The Karnatak University, Dharwad in co-ordination with Dr. D.C. Pavate Foundation and Sidney Sussex College Cambridge, awards three Visiting Fellowships annually for a duration of four months each, to Indians of merit, at the Centre of International Studies / Department of Politics and International Studies, Judge Business School and the Department of Applied Mathematics and Theoretical Physics / Department of Material Sciences and Metallurgy / Department of Chemistry / Department of Zoology, respectively, at the University of Cambridge to pursue research on topics of great importance. The Foundation and the Memorial Fellowship project were set up in 1999-2000 marking the year of Golden Jubilee of the Karnatak University and the Birth Centenary of its architect Late Dr. D.C. Pavate. A former "Wrangler" from Cambridge University, Dr. D.C. Pavate was a visionary in the field of education. He was Vice Chancellor for 14 years, President of the Inter-University Board, a member of the University Grants Commission (UGC), a member of the Executive Council of Commonwealth Universities, and an author of several books in mathematics. Dr. Pavate was the Governor of Punjab from 1967 – 1973. He was awarded 'Padmabhushan' in 1967.

The Foundation came into existence with the liberal financial support from Karnatak University, the Governments of Maharashtra and Punjab, well-wishers and members of the family of Late Dr. Pavate and in a big way from the Government of Karnataka.

One Fellowship is offered on all India basis for study at the Centre of International Studies/ Department of Politics and International Studies, Cambridge in the area of History, Political Science, International Law, International Economics or Military Affairs. The remaining two Fellowships are awarded to Karnataka candidates, for research in the area of business and management science; applied mathematics and theoretical physics / material sciences and metallurgy / chemistry / zoology at Judge Business School and the Department of Applied Mathematics and Theoretical Physics / Department of Material Sciences and Metallurgy / Department of Chemistry / Department of Zoology respectively, at the University of Cambridge. 'Karnataka candidate' means a person who has studied or served in the state of Karnataka for a minimum of 5 years continuously. Preference is given to candidates who in addition to academic achievements, display enterprising capacity to make an impact on one's environment, the drive to transform ideas into realities and who have already played prominent role in particular areas of interest. Candidates under the age of 40 years as on 1<sup>st</sup> January are eligible to apply. Each Fellowship is supported with a stipend of 3500 Pounds Sterling, and the appropriate academic charges at Cambridge University, apart from economy class return airfare. The selected candidates will be senior members of Sidney Sussex College.

Applications are invited during May- July each year. Selection is made by a panel of distinguished academicians and experts in association with the Department of Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, Department of Higher Education Government of Karnataka and the University of Cambridge. The Vice-Chancellor, Karnatak University is the Convener. Information about the award can be obtained from the office of the Coordinator, Dr. D.C.
