Bare by Santana Issar (11 min/2006)

In the piecing together of home videos shot by her parents nearly two decades earlier, and through a string of conversations with her father, mother, and sister, the filmmaker looks to understand the impact of her father's alcoholism on each of their lives.

Mall on top of my House by Aditi Chitre (6 min/2006)

Coastal Bombay, the fish, the fishing community and their homes get buried under concrete, from which emerge tall monoliths - shopping malls, golf links, luxury housing, etc. The protagonist, a pale, vigilant fisherman reminisces about a small house near the sea when he is brought back to a threatening present.





Two Flags by Pankaj Rishi Kumar (86 min/2018)

'Two Flags' chronicles the life and politics of a quaint French town: Pondicherry (India). As the 4600 Tamil French people, gear up for the French Presidential elections (2017), the film explores the idea of identity, citizenship and home in the post colonial era. The film is a visual journey through the town, its homes and its people, witnessing the unfolding of an absurd play of history.
