Concept:

The two great Sanskrit Epics of India, the Ramayana and the Mahabharata have an abiding impact not only on the literature, both Sanskrit and vernacular, but on the Indian civilization as a whole. Indeed, every piece of art and architecture bears testimony to their pervading and long-lasting influence not only in India but also in the Southeast Asian countries: Cambodia is an illustrious example of the diffusion of the epic outside India:

Comprising about one hundred thousand verses and including many sub-stories as well as discourses on dharma, the Mahabharata has been admired for its symbolical richness, its suggesting power and its fascinating resonances and it attracted the attention of great scholars such as V. S. Sukhtankar or R.N. Dandekar in India and M. Biardeau in France.

Being a major work of Indian Literature, it was also adapted in other religious traditions such as Buddhism and Jainism and until today, it has undergone many metamorphoses and performances in Art, Literature and visual Media.

The present International Conference aims at bringing together scholars who focus their study on several aspects of the grand Epic. There will be six Sessions in the following order:

DAY 1: The Textual Traditions of Mahabharata

- Editions and Recensions of Mahabharata
- 2. The Epic and its Commentaries

DAY 2: The Diffusion of Mahabharata

- 3. Jain and Buddhist Adaptations of Mahabharata in India
- 4. The circulation of Mahabharata in South and South-East Asia

DAY 3: Mahabharata in Modern Times

- 5. Mahabharata in Folk Art and Literature
- 6. The Reception of Mahabharata today
